

# COVID-19 Vaccine Administration

Dignity Health Medical Group – Sequoia has begun patient vaccinations on January 22th. We are vaccinating our medical group patients according to vaccine supply and local federal and state guidelines. **Patients must have an appointment before coming to the vaccination location.**

## What You Need To Know (updated January 20, 2021):

**We have a limited number of vaccine appointments.**

### Current Vaccination Group

- We have a limited number of vaccine appointments available and we are prioritizing patients in accordance with guidelines from health agencies.
- Starting January 27, we will be vaccinating established patients who are **75 and older**. Other groups will follow according to federal and state guidelines.
- At this time, we are unable to give vaccinations to community members who are not established patients.\*

### How It Will Work

- To get a COVID-19 vaccination, our eligible patients will receive an email or call to prompt them to make an appointment by the PrepMod vaccination system.
- If you call, we humbly ask for extra patience as call volumes will be extreme.

### Vaccination Details

- No vaccinations will be given without a scheduled appointment.
- When scheduling, patients will be given a time to arrive and all the information they need to receive their vaccination. Hours are subject to change, so they are not posted here.
- Our vaccination site is San Mateo County Event Center at 1346 Saratoga Dr., San Mateo. **Please do not come without an appointment.**
- We are committed to distributing vaccines as equitably and broadly as possible in accordance with prioritization guidelines from health agencies.

### What is Next

- We will continue to post updates on this website, including if and when we are able to offer appointments to more age groups.
- We hope to rapidly scale the deployment of the vaccine and expand it to a larger number of patients as soon as possible. .
