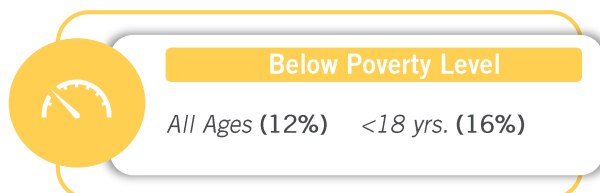
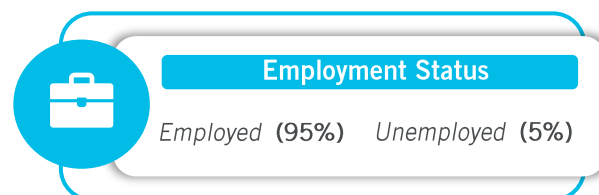
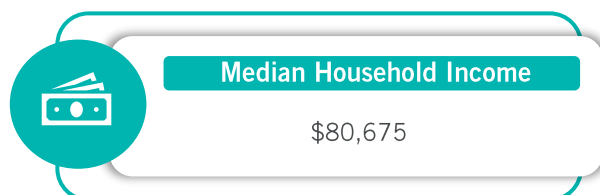
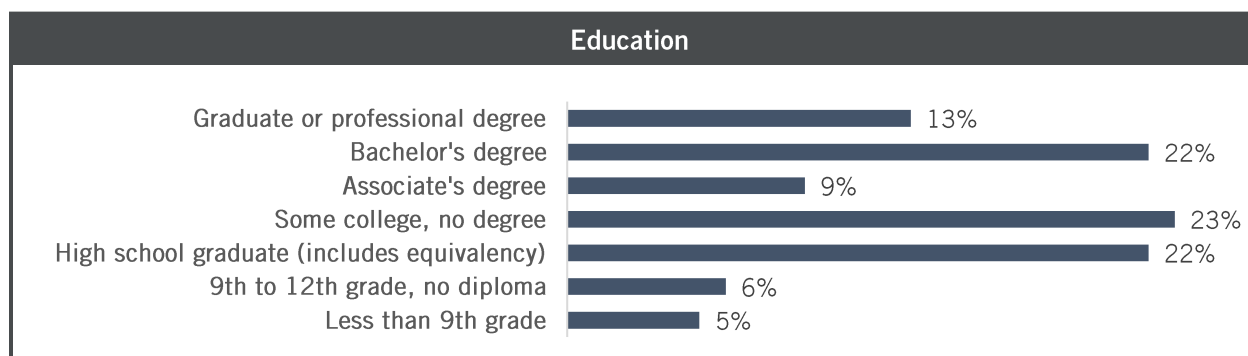
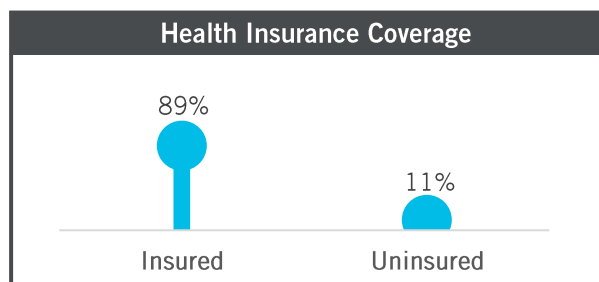
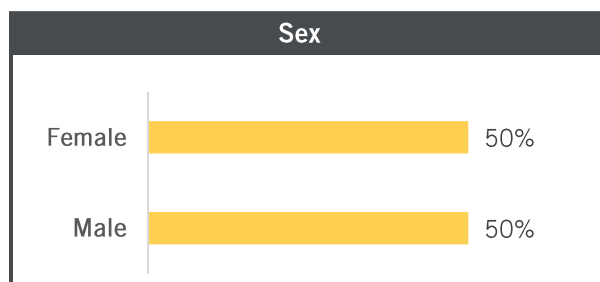
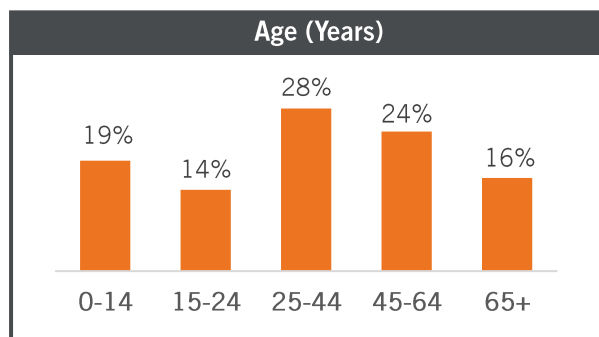
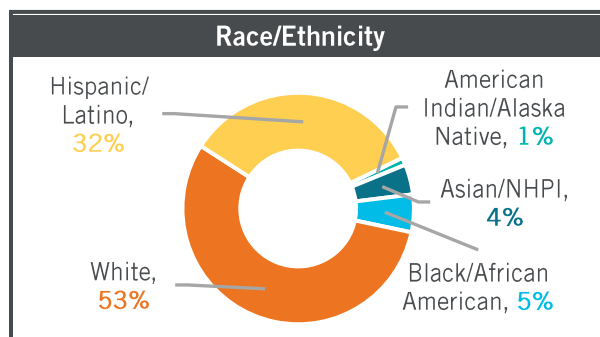
This executive summary provides a snapshot of identified health disparities among selected priorities for Dignity Health St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center's (SJHMC) in Maricopa County. When available, the data provided for the health disparities are 2022 age-adjusted rates per 100,000 people and is based on the Maricopa County population. SJHMC selected the following health priorities for the 2025-2028 community health needs assessment:

Demographic Profile (Maricopa County)

The following demographic data are provided for 2022. Residents in Maricopa County were predominantly **White** and aged **25-44 years**. Despite the **median household income** exceeding **\$80,000**, approximately **12%** of the population live **below the poverty level** and **11%** **lack insurance coverage**, while **5%** are **unemployed**. Education levels vary, with **over 1 in 5** having some college education, holding a **bachelor's degree**, or being **high school graduates**. Additionally, **over 1 in 4** of residents **spoke a language outside of English** at home, reflecting the area's diversity.ⁱ

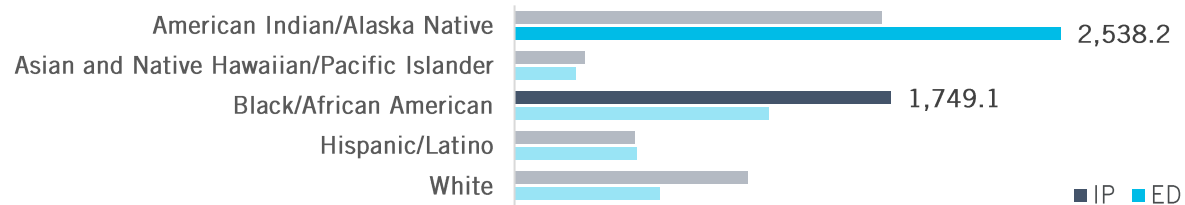


Mental Health

Data is provided for Maricopa County.^{ii, iii, iv} Only nonfatal rates - inpatient hospitalization (IP) and emergency department visits (ED) were reported.

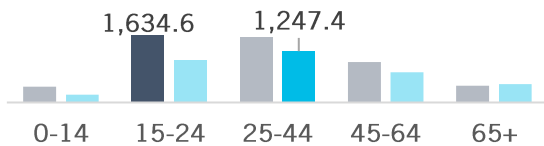
Disparities by Race/Ethnicity

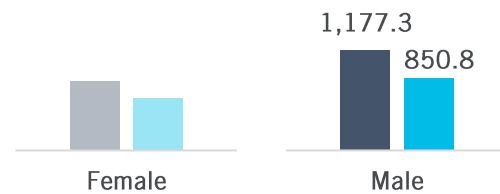
Disparities by Age

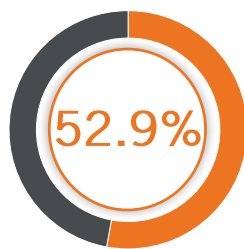


Disparities by Sex

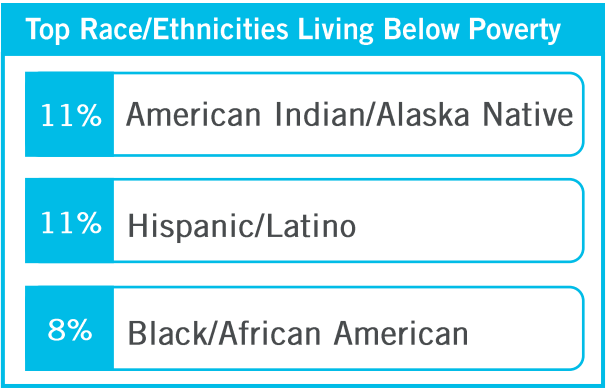
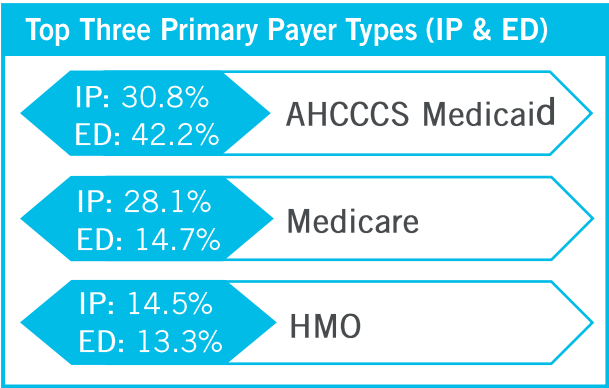
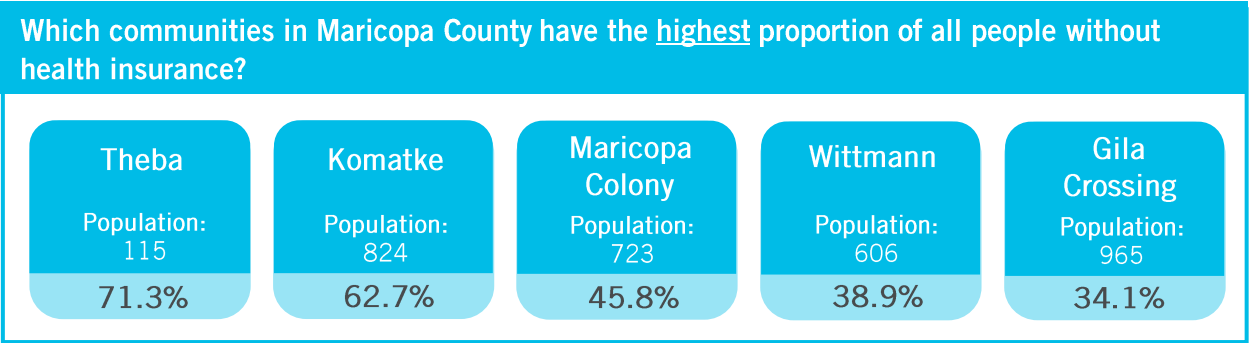

Access to Care

Access to care is vital for ensuring timely medical treatment, preventing serious health issues, and promoting overall well-being. Health insurance enables access to necessary healthcare, but effective access also depends on affordable and available providers who are located nearby.^v Access to care is a priority area for SJHMC. Social Determinants of Health (Housing)

Social determinants of health (SDOH), such as economic stability, social and community support, the built environment, access to quality health care, and education, all play a key role in shaping health outcomes and advancing health equity.^{vii} SDOH like housing is a priority area for SJHMC. Top Communities with an Unsheltered Homelessness Count in Maricopa County

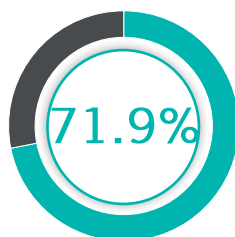

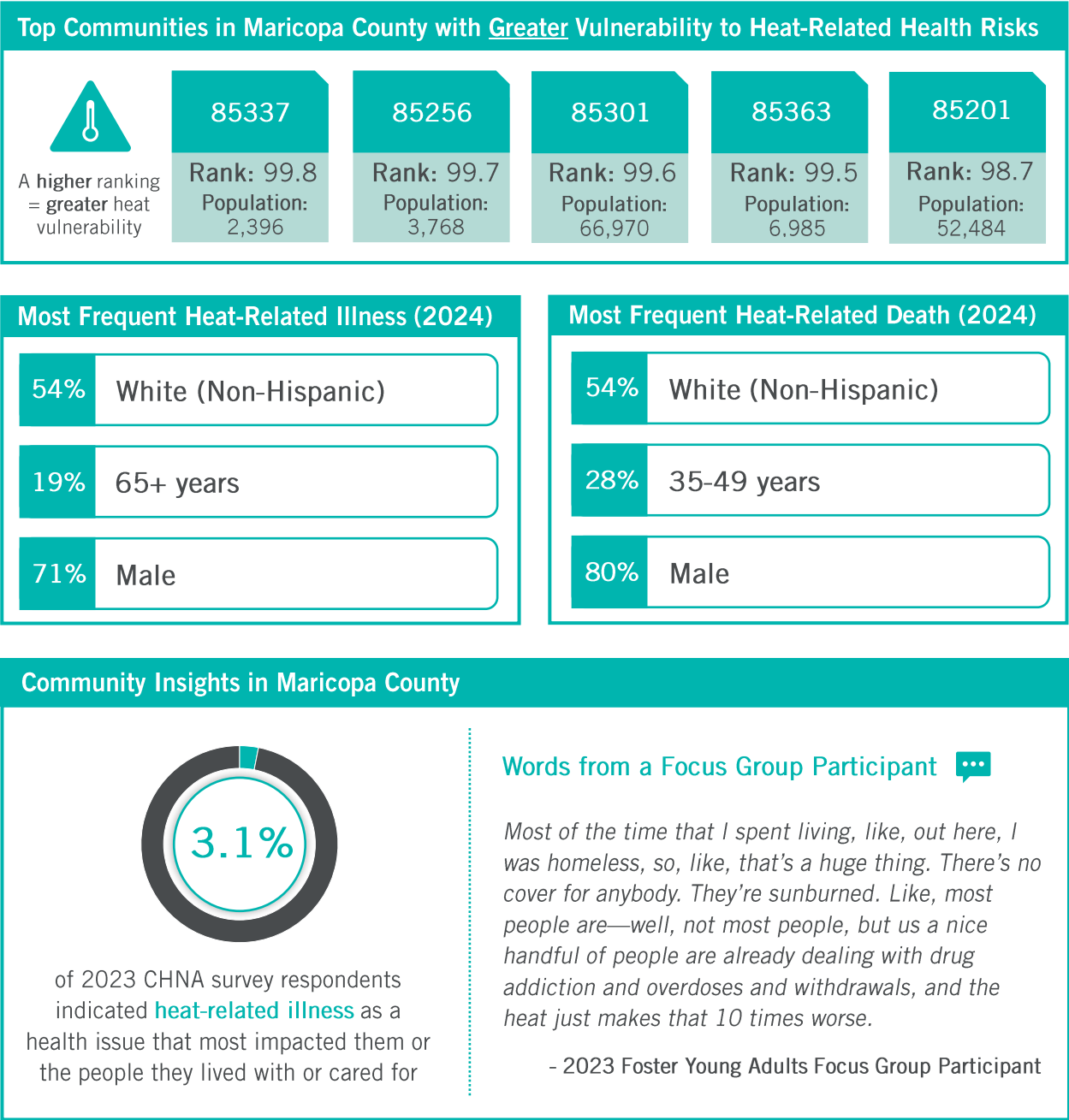

Social Determinants of Health (Heat)

The number of people experiencing extreme heat is rapidly increasing across all regions as a result of climate change.^{ix} Heat stress, the leading cause of weather-related deaths, can exacerbate underlying illnesses such as cardiovascular disease, diabetes, mental health disorders, and asthma.^x SDOH like heat is a priority area for SJHMC. 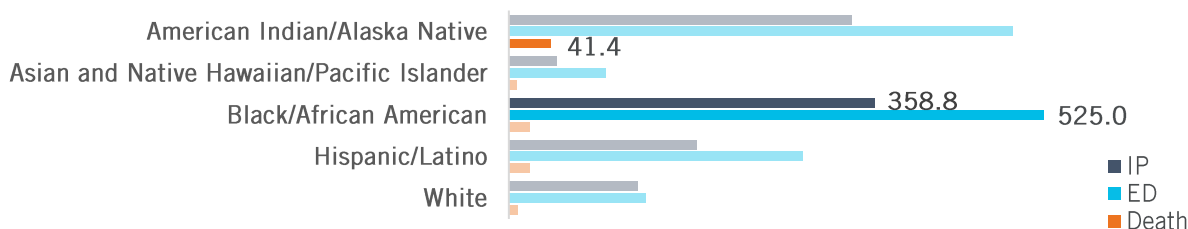


Chronic Conditions

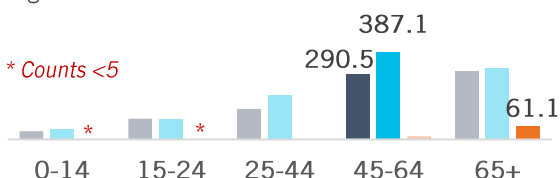

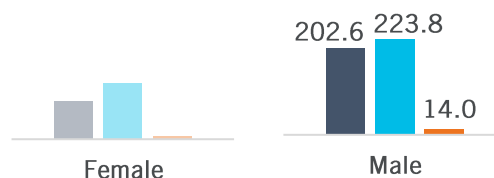

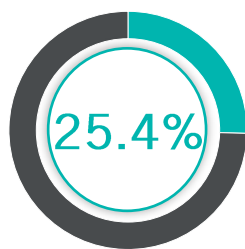


Disparities by Sex

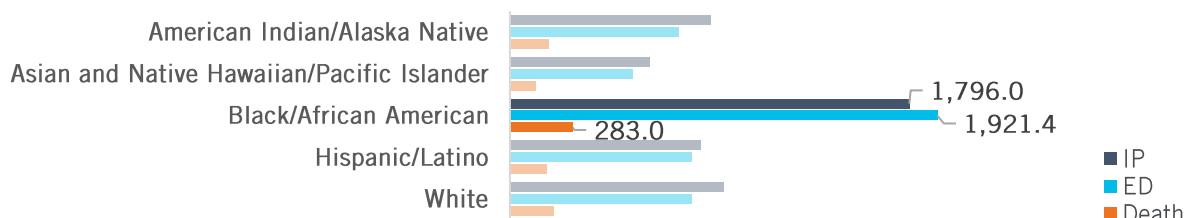

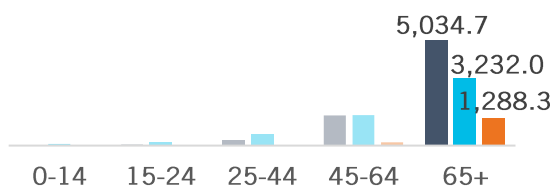

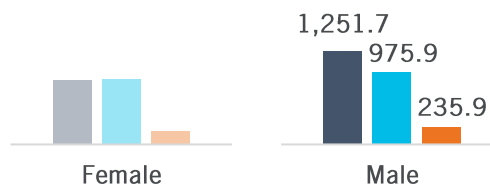

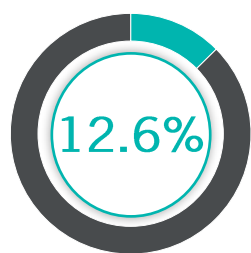

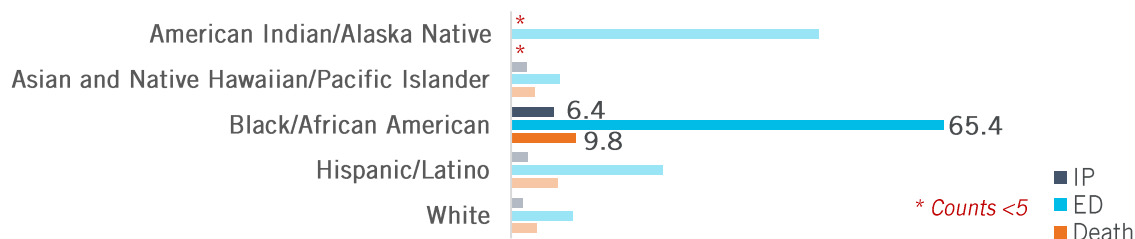

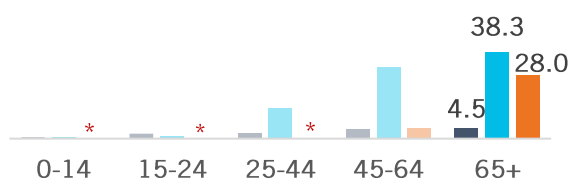

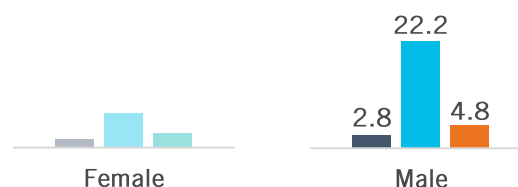

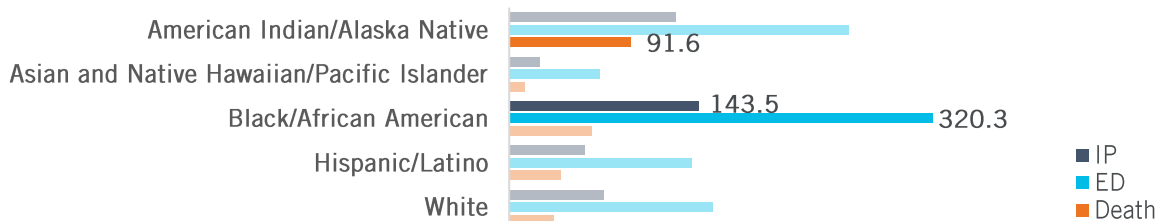

Substance Use

Substance use disorders are linked with many health issues and significantly increase the risk of overdose and death. Opioid use disorder, has seen a sharp increase in fatalities in recent years, highlighting the need for prevention and treatment efforts.^{xiii} Beyond health, substance use impacts families, burdens healthcare systems, and impacts economic productivity and public safety.^{xii} Substance use is a priority area for SJHMC. 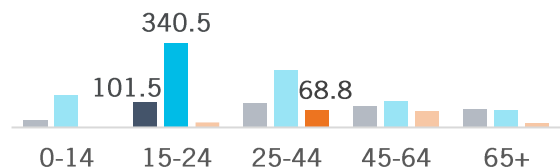

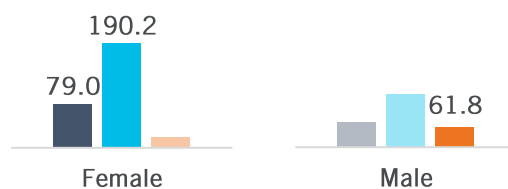

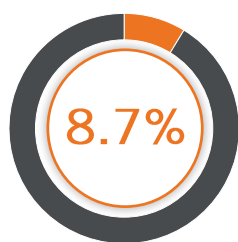


Disparities by Sex

Cancer

Cancer is a leading cause of death worldwide and the most common cancers are breast, lung, colon, and rectum.^{xiv} In Maricopa County, “all cancers” ranked as the second cause of death based on overall rates. In Maricopa County, lung cancer had the greatest death rate in 2022. Data is provided for Maricopa County.^{ii, vi, xv, iii, iv} Only fatal (death) rates were reported.

Maternal and Child Health

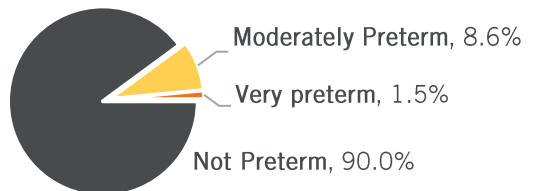

Early health interventions and care during pregnancy, childbirth, and the child's early years lay the foundation for a child's long-term physical, emotional, and cognitive development.^{xvi} Data is provided for Maricopa County.^{ii, xvii, iv}

Distribution of Gestational Age Categories in Maricopa County (2023)

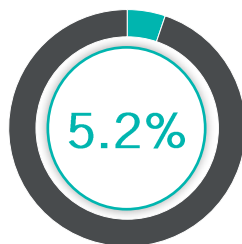


Moderately preterm: 32-36 completed weeks of gestation

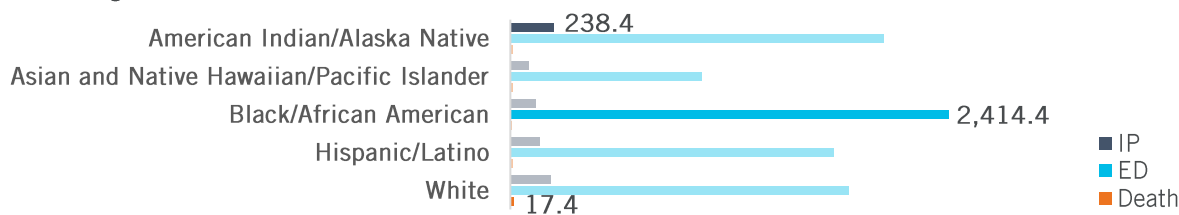

Violence and Injury Prevention

Violence and injury prevention is important because it saves lives, reduces healthcare costs, and creates safer communities. Unintentional and violence-related injuries account for around 4.4 million deaths worldwide each year, representing nearly eight percent of all fatalities.^{xvii} Violence and injury prevention, particularly fall-related injuries is a priority area for SJHMC. Data is provided for Maricopa County.^{ii, iii, iv} Rates for fall-related injuries - inpatient hospitalization (IP), emergency department visits (ED), and death were reported.

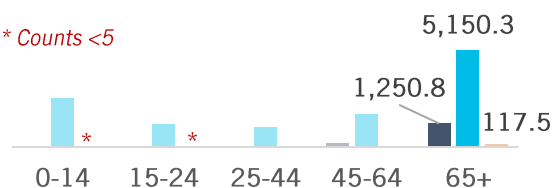

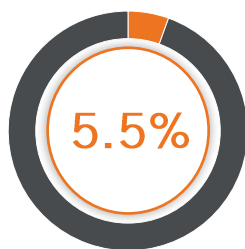

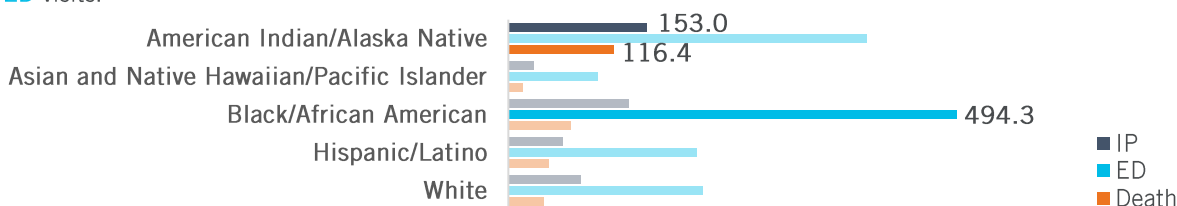

Violence and Injury Prevention

Assault-related injuries can lead to physical and emotional trauma. Exposure to trauma, especially in childhood, can lead to an increased risk of mental illness, suicide, substance abuse, chronic disease, and social issues like violence.^{xvii} Violence and injury prevention, particularly assault-related injuries is a priority area for SJHMC. Data is provided for Maricopa County.^{ii, iii, iv} Rates for assault-related injuries - inpatient hospitalization (IP), emergency department visits (ED), and death were reported.

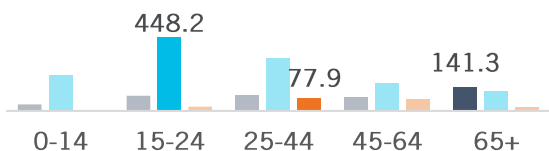

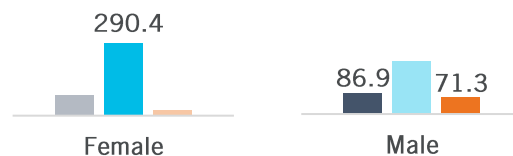

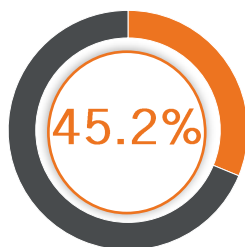


Disparities by Sex
