### SJMC Welcomes New Residents and Fellows

In July, St. Joseph's welcomed its new class of residents and fellows, with 87 new members of the Graduate Medical Education program in nine residencies and four fellowships for the 2024-2025 Academic Year. For the incoming class, St. Joseph's welcomes 57 Californians, including 11 from the Central Valley area, 24 Northern Californians, and 18 previous medical student rotators.

St. Joseph's rapidly-growing Graduate Medical Education program, which was launched in 2018, helps train and retain physicians in San Joaquin Community and to maintain and expand services we offer to our community. Current Residency specialties include Anesthesia, **Emergency Medicine**, Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Neurology, Orthopedic Surgery, Psychiatry, Transitional Year, and Urology in addition to four Fellowships, Cardiovascular Disease, Critical Care Medicine, Simulation, and Ultrasound. <u>Ultimately.</u> St. Joseph's will have 17 programs with over 270 residents and fellows by 2028.



#### SJMC Residents Engage with Decision Medicine Students

A group of SJMC Residents led interactive activities in the Sim Lab for the 2024 cohort of the San Joaquin Medical Society's Decision Medicine students. #### St. Joseph's Medical Center Graduates Residents

Dignity Health St. Joseph's Medical Center recently graduated residents from its Anesthesia, Emergency Medicine, Family Medicine, and Internal Medicine Residency Programs. Among the graduates were four Anesthesia residents, who were part of an inaugural cohort split between two postgraduates from 2021. Additionally, St. Joseph's Psychiatry Residency Program marked a milestone with one resident graduating early to pursue fellowship training in New England. Out of the 31 graduates, nine will continue their training in fellowships, with three remaining at St. Joseph's for fellowships in Cardiology, Simulation, and Ultrasound. The other six graduates will complete fellowships in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Critical Care Medicine, Pediatric Anesthesia Critical Care Medicine, and Sports Medicine at various institutions. Twenty graduates will practice in California, including five who will remain locally and four in the Greater Sacramento Valley. St. Joseph's is committed to retaining its residents to promote a healthier future for both the community and the Greater Central Valley. As one-chapter closes, another begins. St. Joseph's values its trainees and recognizes the positive impact they have on the community-centered mission.
