EMERGENCY BLOOD ALGORITHM

1 unit of Cryo will automatically be provided for every even numbered Code Crimson Pack (1 Cryo per 8 units of RBC's).

Code Crimson

Patient is bleeding and in need of blood

Initiate Code Crimson based on the provider's clinical judgment of massive exsanguination and expected resuscitation needs. If Physician Leader is needed, initiate an RRT.

For urgent (< 5 mins) blood product release in patients that are not at risk for exsanguination or in whom, less than 4 units of PRBCs are required, please call the Blood Bank (Ext 5172) for Emergency Uncrossmatched Type O Packed Red Blood Cells

Code Crimson is initiated through Perfect Serve. The following information should be provided:

- a. Code Crimson
- b. Patient First and Last Name, Location, Age, and Gender
- c. Medical Record Number (if available)
- d. Responsible physician or LIP leader of the Code Crimson
- e. Status of initial blood sample for type and crossmatch
- f. Suspected diagnosis/cause of bleeding

The Code Crimson alert will trigger the Laboratory/Blood Bank to begin processing a Transfusion Pack immediately. A Transfusion Pack includes:

- a. 4 units of Packed Red Blood Cells (PRBCs)
- b. 4 regular size units of fresh frozen plasma (FFP)
- c. 1 bag of plateletpheresis
- 1 pooled Cryo will be included with every other pack

Blood and Product Ratios recommended

- 4 Units PRBCs
- 4 Regular FFP (or 2 Jumbo)
- 1 Unit platelets
- 1 Cryo per 8 Units PRBCs

Cryo is indicated when DIC is suspected or massive transfusion with dilutional coagulopathy
