Ovary Cancer

September is "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month," Ovarian cancer is a relatively rare cancer, statistically speaking. However, it is often called "the silent killer" because its symptoms are often vague and the disease is usually diagnosed at an advanced stage, which renders it difficult to cure in many cases.

Exciting and hopeful research is being conducted, however. Last year, a study from the United Kingdom was published indicating it may be possible to detect ovary cancer earlier before it spreads.

Our understanding of the genetic and molecular basis for ovarian cancer is evolving and improving rapidly. It is now believed that up to 20% of all ovary cancers are "familial" in nature. Genetic testing allows us to identify other family members who may also carry a genetic mutation, which predisposes them to ovary cancer (or other cancers).

September is Also Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

This month is a time to recognize those who have faced prostate cancer and those who work tirelessly to help fight this disease, and a time to bring awareness and education about the facts of prostate cancer.

Here are some facts on prostate cancer:

- About 1 in 7 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime.
- It is estimated there will be 161,360 new cases of prostate cancer in 2017.
- There are more than 2.9 million survivors of prostate cancer in the United States.
- The risk of getting prostate cancer is higher with a family history of the disease. Having a father or brother with prostate cancer increases the risk to 83 percent.
- Approximately 60 percent of prostate cancer cases are diagnosed in men older than 65.
- PSA tests measures levels of prostate-specific antigen in the prostate, not cancer. Although some data indicates PSA test can save lives, there is an emerging new debate about the effectiveness of the PSA screening. Consult with your primary care physician about whether you should be screened.
- Research has shown certain foods, such as tomato-based foods and fatty fish like salmon and tuna, may help protect against the development of prostate cancer.

Talk to your doctor to know your risk and the correct screening options for you. Consider making lifestyle changes such as eating a healthy diet, exercising regularly and of course, scheduling your regular doctor check-up!



Breast Cancer is the most common cancer for women.

It is reported 1 in 8 women will be diagnosed this year with breast cancer. However, in recent years the death rate from the disease has steadily gone down because of a variety of factors, including early detection.

Who qualifies for the screening?

- Women who do not qualify for any local, state or federal program to cover the cost of a screening mammogram.
- Women with no suspicious findings on a clinic breast exam (i.e. lumps, discharge, etc.).
- Women with no past history of abnormal results on a screening mammogram.
