Nurse Navigator Program

When you are diagnosed with cancer, it is crucial to quickly coordinate all aspects of care. Our Nurse Navigator helps guide, advocate for, and support those who find themselves undergoing a complicated diagnostic process.

No cost services include:

- Facilitating access to services before diagnosis, through treatment and survivorship
- Provides information regarding cancer diagnosis, treatment, genetic testing, and local cancer care
- Making patient time with health care providers more productive by assisting patients with identifying their immediate concerns to address with their doctor
- Access to financial and social services
- Finding transportation and/or mileage reimbursements for travel to appointments

Please note that the Nurse Navigator makes *no direct referrals* to physicians, but rather facilitates access to practitioners chosen by their treating physicians.
