






Overview

Cardiovascular disease (CVD) is the number one cause of death in women in the United States and the developed world. New research has identified novel risk factors specific to women such as pregnancy related heart conditions, or conditions more prominent in women such as rheumatologic disorders or mental health. While public health initiatives have increased awareness in these areas, there is still confusion among health care providers about risk assessment and best practice with regards to management of women with heart disease. A review of the most current evidence-based guidelines for the prevention of heart disease in women with a focus on the management of diseases as catered to the unique pathophysiology of women, will provide medical practitioners with a clear understanding of the best practice to ensure women are not just treated as "little men".



Learning Objectives

- Assess how to risk stratify women, using existing calculators and the additional use of novel risk factors such as pregnancyrelated conditions
- Identify patients to refer for cardiology specialists or maternal fetal medicine/high risk obstetrics
