For more than 25 years, our highly trained and experienced staff has helped patients develop the skills needed to return to a life of independence. We are located within Mercy General Hospital, a tertiary acute care hospital. Our unit provides 24-hour nursing and physician coverage along with the region's leading specialists.

Our Program

We are the first acute rehabilitation program in Sacramento accredited by the Commission on Accreditation on Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF). We have achieved the highest standards specializing in the most comprehensive and complex rehabilitation programs for patients with functional loss due to disabling illness or injury. Such illnesses include:

- Stroke
- Traumatic and non-traumatic brain injury
- Spinal cord injury
- Amputation
- Orthopedic conditions
- Major multiple trauma
- Cardiac conditions
- Parkinson's disease
- Multiple sclerosis
- Polyarthritis

Patients work toward personalized, attainable goals with the support and reinforcement of our nursing, therapy and medical staff. Our patients:

- Relearn how to perform daily activities
- Regain vital thinking, problem-solving and organizational skills
- Adapt and compensate for the effects of a medical event or injury as they transition back to community living



Our Accreditation

Mercy General Hospital is renowned for its experience, dedication and hard work in providing the highest quality of care. Our rehabilitation program was the first in Sacramento to receive CARF accreditation in 2010. Since our initial accreditation, we have gone on to receive specialty CARF certifications in stroke and traumatic brain injury.



Our Results

Our focus to help patients reach independence has led to some of the highest success rates in the region.

- Nearly 90% of our patients are discharged home, more than any other major rehabilitation program in the region.
- 96% of our patients report continued functional gains three months after discharge.

He completed a pre-doctoral fellowship in anatomy and osteopathic manipulative medicine, and later graduated from the University of New England College of Osteopathic Medicine. He recently completed his rehabilitation residency at the University of California Davis Medical Center. His special interests include spinal cord injury and musculoskeletal care.

Our Facility

It's important that our patients and their families feel as comfortable as possible while undergoing the rehabilitation process. We've created a nurturing, holistic space to meet the unique needs of our rehabilitation patients.

Our amenities include:

- 22 large private rooms and three semi-private rooms
- Wi-Fi access throughout the hospital
- Flat screen televisions with cable
- Community dining room
- Transition Room to prepare our patients for living at home
- Outdoor patio for dining and recreation
- Life skills suite to engage in retraining of home management skills

We also take our patients on weekly outings to engage in community mobility and recreational activities.

Our Guidelines

To be admitted to the Mercy General Hospital Acute Rehabilitation program, a patient must:

- Demonstrate appropriate functional and medical needs
- Demonstrate the capacity to participate in three hours of daily intensive therapy
- Have a safe discharge destination and appropriate assistance from caregivers or family members
