Supporting Healthy Communities

In the wake of COVID-19, hospitals throughout the state, including Methodist Hospital of Sacramento, are seeing a decline in patients seeking care when they need it. We want to assure you that our hospitals and medical offices are safe and ready to care for anyone who needs it. Additionally, expanded access to telemedicine services makes it easier for you to connect with your doctor. Most routine and acute care visits can be done from the comfort of your home. Dr. Christine Baird explains in this video how virtual visits are a convenient way to stay current on your health care needs.

Dignity Health has also partnered with several local organizations to give back to our friends, neighbors and those in need. We recently partnered with the American Heart Association on the 'Don't Die of Doubt' awareness campaign to curb an alarming trend of individuals delaying care due to concerns of potentially contracting COVID-19 at local hospitals.

In an effort to address the spread of COVID-19 among populations that have and continue to be disproportionately impacted by this deadly virus, Dignity Health has joined forces with our health system counterparts to provide funding to a Latinx public health campaign, in collaboration with La Familia, other stakeholders including the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County and other community-based organizations. The Latinx community currently accounts for 56 percent of COVID-19 cases and 46 percent of COVID-19 deaths, according to data from the state's health department of public health.

Community Forums

Over the past few months, we have participated in and hosted several events to hear directly from you about issues that matter and share how Dignity Health can strengthen our ties with the Elk Grove community. I was honored to speak to the residents of Del Webb during a virtual community meeting in August, as well as host a <u>Facebook Live town hall with Councilman Darren Suen</u>. We will continue participating in more community meetings to share more information and progress on Dignity Health's plan to build Elk Grove's first hospital.

Supporting our Health Care Heroes

During this pandemic we have received overwhelming support from the Elk Grove community. Businesses, non-profits, community groups and individuals have come together to support their health care heroes.
