My name is Dr. Brian Evans and it is my privilege to serve as the new President/CEO of Dignity Health Mercy Hospital of Folsom. It has been an honor to work with Michael Korpiel during this transition, and I thank him for the work he has done managing both Mercy Hospital of Folsom and Mercy San Juan Medical Center over the past year. For those that don't know me, I spent over 15 years as an emergency medicine physician before transitioning to hospital administration. During my career, I have held the titles of Chief of Medicine, Chief Medical Officer and for the past three years, President/CEO of Dignity Health Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital.

Dignity Health and the City of Folsom have a special partnership that spans over four decades. It is not a typical transactional relationship, but rather two entities working together to achieve a healthy and prosperous future for the place we call home. Recently, we announced our Folsom Ranch Medical Center project. Folsom Ranch Medical Center

Dignity Health is excited to continue to expand our footprint in Folsom. Over the next few years, we are planning to construct a new medical campus in the Folsom Ranch area of East Bidwell Parkway. The 530,000 square-foot Folsom Ranch Campus will start with the construction of a brand new medical office building, and will eventually grow to include a medical center with a 100-bed hospital, two medical office buildings and a helipad. This facility's size will also allow us the flexibility to expand as needed alongside the community.

In May, the Folsom Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the project. On June 8, the Folsom City Council unanimously voted to approve the building of our Folsom Ranch Campus. Dignity Health would like to thank both the Planning Commission, the City Council and our community for their support of the project. We look forward to working collectively over the next several decades to continue to ensure that Folsom and the surrounding area have access to high-quality medical care.

COVID-19 Vaccination Update

Although Governor Newsom lifted most restrictions on June 15, COVID-19 continues to be a threat to those who are not vaccinated. If you have not done so already, please contact the <u>Sacramento County Department of Public Health</u> to find where you can get your vaccine.
