Additionally, Woodland Memorial Hospital has been recognized as an LGBTQ+ Healthcare Equality Leader by the Human Rights Campaign Foundation and is a Joint Commission-certified Primary Stroke Center. In 2025, it was honored by the American Hospital Association for 100 years of membership in the organization, one of only 50 hospitals to receive this recognition.
