

Patient Visitation Policies

**ALL SUPPORT PEOPLE
MUST SHOW PROOF OF*:**



- COVID-19 Vaccination *or*
- Negative COVID-19 Test (taken within the last 72 hours)

**Exemptions provided for end of life patients*

NO VISITORS

- COVID+ Patients
- Patients in Isolation Precautions

SUPPORT PERSONS ALLOWED FOR THE FOLLOWING PATIENTS:



- Outpatient Procedures
- Outpatient Visits
 - 1 support person for drop-off and discharge instructions
 - Support person must remain in their vehicle until patient is discharged



- Emergency Room
 - Patients 18 years and older:
 - 1 support person if needed for care or discharge instructions
 - Patients 18 years and younger:
 - 2 legal guardians



- NICU
- Pediatrics
 - 2 support people



- Inpatients
 - 1 support person for drop-off and pick-up of the patient and discharge instructions



- Family Birthing Center
 - 1 Birth Partner/Coach and Doula during labor & delivery
 - 1 support person during post-partum recovery



- Exceptions for patients with the following conditions:
 - Comfort Care
 - Palliative Care
 - Dementia
 - Physical, Intellectual, Developmental Disabilities
 - Cognitive Impairment
 - 2 support people, 1 at a time



Support persons will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms at entrances.



Support persons must be symptom-free and must wear a mask at all times regardless of vaccine or testing status.



Support persons should primarily stay in the patient's room.



No children under the age of 14.



Support persons must maintain physical distancing of 6 feet.



Additional patient visitation requests will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.



Visitation access and restrictions are applied regardless of individual characteristics as outlined in regulation including but not limited to sex, race, color, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, marital status, age, registered domestic partner status, citizenship, or immigration status.

Compliance with the above guidelines is necessary for continued visitation.
