Cultural and Linguistic Competency Statement

AB 496 expands the definition of cultural competency as follows: Understanding and applying cultural and ethnic data to the process of clinical care, including, as appropriate, information pertinent to the appropriate treatment of, and provision of care to, the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and intersex communities.
