Tuesday, August 27, 2019	Course (#1): Massive Transfusion in Trauma/ Massive Transfusion Protocol	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Demonstrate proper application of St. Mary's Massive Transfusion Protocol for actively hemorrhaging patients. 2. Explain the indications for ordering the Massive Transfusion Protocol and endpoints of resuscitation 3. Recognize the need for balanced hemostatic resuscitation and how this affects oxygen delivery and coagulopathy.

Explain basic ventilator strategies for the emergently intubated patients 2. Compare lung protective vs obstructive approaches to ventilation and apply methods based on patient physiology
Monday, September 16, 2019	Course (#3): DVT Prophylaxis in Trauma	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Discuss timeframes for establishing DVT prophylaxis in the acutely injured trauma patient. 2. Appraise indications and contraindications for initiation of DVT prophylaxis in patients with traumatic injuries.
Tuesday, October 15, 2019	Workshop (#4): Intraosseous Insertion Workshop	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Demonstrate correct application and technique for intraosseous insertion. 2. Recall appropriate anatomical locations, indications, and contraindications for intraosseous access.
Wednesday, October 23, 2019	Workshop (#5): Midline Catheter Insertion	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Identify vascular anatomy and appropriate locations using visual landmarks and ultrasound imagery for midline vascular access. 2. Demonstrate the use of ultrasound techniques to identify vessels for midline catheter insertion 3. Demonstrate correct technique for "one-touch" midline vascular access placement.
