Each year the hospital treats 70,500 patients in the Emergency Department, delivers over 2,100 babies, performs over 700 open-heart surgeries and admits more than 17,000 patients for treatment.

As the community has grown and medical care has evolved, St. Bernardine has expanded to meet the need. A multi-million dollar investment over the last decade has provided crucial facility upgrades to offer patients the latest digital diagnostics and the most advanced procedures. A highly sophisticated center for the critically ill was added, along with many other upgrades, including the latest catheterization labs and equipment for heart and vascular treatment, an endovascular hybrid surgical suite, and an outpatient center for imaging, with the latest mammography and stereotactic breast biopsy services.

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

- Emergency Services: 24-hour on-site emergency services, with STEMI heart attack certification.
- Imaging Services: Inpatient diagnostic services, including 64-slice CT, MRI, ultrasound and nuclear medicine. Outpatien Center for Imaging, including advanced mammography and stereotactic breast biopsy.
- Inland Empire Heart & Vascular Institute: Diagnostic, vascular and interventional services, electrophysiology, cardiothoracic surgery and cardiac rehabilitation
- Maternal/Child Health Services: All private labor/delivery/recovery suites and patient rooms, a 20-bed Level II Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and a Baby & Family education and support center.
- Neurological Care Services: Inpatient and outpatient neurosurgica and neurodiagnostic services.

OUTREACH SERVICES

Baby & Family Center: Located on the hospital campus, this Center offers a nurturing environment and caring staff focused on promoting family health and well-being and improved access to care. Services help prepare, educate and support the community, with programs ranging from prenatal education to breast-feeding assistance, from chronic disease self-management to citizenship classes.

Family Focus Center: Located across from San Bernardino High School, the Center provides healthy alternatives for at-risk youth and their families. The opportunities available include a "Late Night Hoops" basketball league, summer camp, after-school mentoring and tutoring, as well as literacy, violence prevention and career development programs.

Stepping Stones: This hospital-based program offers career exploration through a resource center and mentoring opportunities, and enables high school and college students, along with other young adults, to volunteer in a hospital setting.
